Kids' Club:

Kids ages 4 to 12 enjoy a vast array of activities under the guidance of our experienced Kids' Club counselor team. As a part of the summer season, Kids' Club offers three sessions a day. In the morning, Kids' Club opens at 9 am for its nature-based program. Activities are steered towards an out of doors experience and run until noon. Afternoon Kids' Club is from 1 pm - 3pm and is an activity based team activity program. Activities are geared to keeping the children moving. After a late afternoon break, our Evening Kids' Club program kicks off at 6 pm.
